MVE & FH are Tooting on Straws?



Yup. **Director Bryan Ziegler** is using straws with his choruses. It is part of a series of researched warmups called **SOVT Exercises**, or <u>Semi-Occluded Vocal</u> <u>**Tracks**</u> – a fancy way to say that the mouth is "partially closed." It doesn't stand for the Soviet Union. In straw phonation, you make sounds through the straw.

There are **four main benefits** to straw phonation that you can read about below. There are several benefits for doing this including during straw phonation there is **less impact, collision, and stress on the vocal folds.** For an extended discussion of the benefits, see the Voice Science article: <u>Straw Phonation -</u> <u>VoiceScienceWorks</u>



Happy Birthday to Bryan Ziegler & the Greendale Chapter






The Chapter sings Happy Birthday to you, Bryan, and to us on Wednesday, **April 29, 2023**, our official charter date.

Carroll University June 3, 2023 FH & MVE Concert at 7PM!



The facility contains the Dorothy Goff Frisch Recital Hall, a music library, the Russell Memorial Chapel, an auditorium, a Shantz 69-rank organ and Steinway grand piano, and updated sound, light and video systems, as well as updated digital equipment systems in the piano lab. [*Editor's Note:* The cross symbol with a dove above it on

the Shattuck Music Center is the symbol used by the Presbyterian Church, and Carroll Univ. is a Presbyterian University.

Where is Carroll University?

Whether coming from the west or the east on I-94, most exits from I-94 have roads that lead to downtown Waukesha, about 4 miles south of I-94. Carroll is near downtown Waukesha, but just to the east of it. Your GPS should get you to **218 North East Avenue, Waukesha, WI** in excellent fashion.

WAUKESHA PEWAUKEE

Typically, coming from Madison, one good exit is **284** to **County Highway J**, south. From Madison, it is 65 miles and takes 1 hour 6 minutes. <u>driving directions - Search (bing.com)</u>

Typically, coming from Milwaukee, one good exit is **297, head right on the ramp to County Highway JJ/US-18/WI-164.** It is 19 miles and 25 minutes. <u>driving directions -</u> <u>Search (bing.com)</u>

Interview with Rochelle and Chip Hartmann

Greendaler asks: We are very happy to get to know you both better. **Chip** sings both with MVE as a bass with **Forward Harmony**. **Rochelle**, what part do you sing and how did you get started in barbershop singing?

Rochelle says: I

sing Tenor in Forward Harmony, Crosstown Harmony & the quartet Cool Beans. I've been singing all my life.

I started in church & school. I got private voice lessons when I was in high school. I took piano lessons in grade school (although I'm not that good a player.) I sang in school choirs in



grade school & high school, some solo experiences in both grade school & high school. After high school I went on to UW-Milwaukee and majored in voice. That was short lived as opera was not my passion. My parents took me to **Menoharmonee** shows starting at age 12. I found & joined **Harmoni-Q** chorus in the mid 90's. I met fabulous women who loved music as much as I did & I had a blast learning about barbershop harmony! A pickup quartet was my first experience & we sang at a chorus event, it was fun & I wanted more.

I started a quartet that year named **Trouble** with 3 other women who I've been great friends with ever since. We had to change our name the next year because someone registered that name before we did so we changed our name to **Intoxicatin' Rhythm**. For many years that quartet name stayed with us but some of the members changed a few times. We competed & sang together all over the city for 10 years. **Harmoni-Q** Chorus merged with **The Milwaukee Skyline Chorus** & became **The Milwaukee Showcase Chorus** in the late 90's. We took the chorus on tour in 2008 to Russia & that was an amazing experience.

April 2023

I sang with a new quartet in called **Twitch** in 2011 & 2012 we took 3rd place both years at the regional competitions had a good time together but decided to go our separate ways at that time. I then sang in a quartet named **Epix** with 2 other members of **Forward Harmony** & we took 1st place at regional 3 years in a row and competed at international.

In 2013 **Milwaukee Showcase Chorus** merged with **Crosstown Harmony** chorus & I've been singing with them ever since. I sang in a quartet named **Ruckus** & then another one named **Gems** after that. I've delivered singing Valentine's every year except for during Covid. Last year I joined an established Quartet named **Cool Beans**. I've known all three of these ladies for years & we

are having a great time getting to know each other better. Having so much fun! Right now, we're very busy getting ready for our Regional Competition next month. I also sing in our church choir with Chip & his parents.

Greendaler asks: Thanks, **Rochelle**, wonderful experiences for sure. Same for you **Chip**, how did you get started singing?

Chips replies: I sang with **MVE** in the nineties and left the chorus when I moved to Madison, WI for work. I also sing bass in our church choir. I recently rejoined MVE at the same time that we both started singing with **Forward Harmony**.



Greendaler asks: We'd like to know what you both do for a living?

Rochelle says: I am a Homemaker & I also sell **Young Living Essential Oils**

Chip says: I lead a team of appliance technicians for the southeastern Wisconsin area.

Greendaler asks: Tell us a bit about your family?

Rochelle or Chip says: We have 2 boys. One is 25 and works at the **Howard Company** running a crew that builds the outdoor menus for fast food restaurants & the other is 18 and a Senior at **Wisconsin Lutheran High School**, He's trying to decide if he should be a Mechanic or a Steamfitter. We also have a cat & her





name is **Kyra Taffy**. We usually just call her **Fat Kitty** because she is almost 20lbs.

Greendaler asks: Where did you both grow up and how did you meet? How long are you married?

Rochelle says: I grew up in Muskego, WI & we recently inherited my childhood home. We've been married for 20 years.

Chip adds: I was born in New Ulm, MN. My family moved to Bay View,
