How May We Participate in Singing Valentines, You Asked?

We have two fantastic opportunities to make someone's day brighter on Valentine's Day, Wednesday, February 14, 2024!

1. <u>Pick-up quartets</u> (or established quartets) can learn 1 (or 2) love songs and make a day of bringing sunshine (and often blushes) to people in the Milwaukee/Waukesha area. The day runs like this:



- a. Meet at Bonita's house in the morning to pick up your assigned singouts, roses, cards, and info cards (and have a cup of coffee and a sweet roll).
- b. Your quartet travels according to the list (some are time specific) and finds the recipient, serenades them with a love song, presents them with a rose and a personalized card, and gets your picture taken (by the 5th wheel*) with the delighted recipient.
- c. Anyone who says, "That was great! Can I get one done for my sweetheart today?" hand them an info card (they can call and <u>probably</u> get one

done that day)

- d. Repeat b. & c. until your assignments are complete.
- e. Go have a cocktail and toast yourselves to make someone's day perfect.
- 2. ****NEW !** Established quartets** (or pick-up quartets who want to learn 4 or 5 new songs) are being asked to stroll through a restaurant for an hour, singing for

whoever would like a song. You will also present a rose and offer to take a picture (see 5th wheel* below). Your evening would go like this:

- a. Collect roses from Bonita
- b. Sing at an assigned restaurant
- c. Anyone who says, "That was great! Can I get one done for my sweetheart today?" hand them an info card (they can call and <u>probably</u> get one done that day)
- d. Go have a cocktail and celebrate your part in a delightful surprise for someone.

 - (2) With a specific quartet
 - e. You are an established quartet and would like:
 - (1) To sing all day
 - (2) To sing in a restaurant
 - (3) Both



- II. **What's a 5th wheel** you may ask? The 5th wheel is usually the driver and always the one who takes the picture of the quartet and recipient. The 5th wheel will also carry a bunch of roses to distribute in the restaurant setting. 5th wheels can be anyone who wants to have a fun day but not necessarily sing. (If the 5th wheel pouts, you can let them sing too.)
- III. Established quartets (or overachiever pick-up quartets) Is there a favorite restaurant you would like to contact to see if they'd let you sing? We're asking \$200.

Interview of Robin Kelby of Forward Harmony

Greendaler asks: Robin, how did you get started in singing? What part do you sing in **Forward Harmony**?

Robin says: I have been singing since I was two; my mom would stand me up on a piano bench while she accompanied the both of us. We have sung together for longer than I can remember.

She also got me involved in barbershop when I was in 7th grade through Harmony Camp, which was a barbershop summer camp the **Singing Buckeyes** used to organize. I am a baritone in **Forward Harmony** (as well as in **Yahara River Chorus** in Sweet Adelines).

Greendaler asks: Where did you go to High School? Tell us about your family when growing up.

Robin replies: I'm from SE Ohio, and I went to Ohio Virtual Academy, which is an online, public charter school, from 3rd grade through the end of high school. I was doing online learning waaaaaay before it was cool!



I am an only child, but because my parents are divorced and both have remarried, I now have 4 stepsiblings, which is a lot to wrap one's head around.

Greendaler asks: Where did you go to college and what was your major?

Greendaler asks: Wow, that's great. Where do you work? And where do you live now?


Robin says: I work at **Epic Systems** in **Verona; WI** and I live just a few minutes from Epic. I am a software developer on the Beans team, which supports dialysis and kidney care organizations and providers.

Greendaler asks: I know you have preferences in the pronouns you use, such as they/them. If you wish, tell us a bit about your pronoun usage, please.

Robin answers: I am a nonbinary person, which means that I do not identify as either male or female. I'm just me! I really appreciate it when folks refer to me using they/them/theirs pronouns because they are the closest pronouns that "fit" who I am. One of the reasons why I really love singing with **Forward Harmony** (besides our amazingly gorgeous sound) is that when I watch us perform, we reflect the way I see myself.

Greendaler says: What are some of your non-singing talents or interests?

Robin replies: I do a lot of crafts (primarily knit and crochet, but also diamond painting, nalbinding (The Beginner's Guide to Nalbinding (Scandinavian Knotless Knitting) (morningchores.com), pin loom weaving, beading, origami, and so much more).



I am also heavily involved in my church as a Certified Lay Speaker (I can preach when there's a need for someone to fill in) and as the District Lay Leader for the SW district of the Wisconsin Conference of the **United Methodist Church** (I help with programming and organizing the non-clergy United Methodists in Wisconsin).

I also play several instruments, including banjolele and autoharp, I love to cook, and I enjoy photography (especially in nature).

Greendaler asks: What has surprised you most as a member of **Forward Harmony**?

Robin says: One of the things that surprised me was the dedication that we all share and a drive to do the very best we can, both as individuals and as a chorus. I have also really appreciated how welcoming folks are and the ways we support and encourage each other.

Interview with Deana Grade of Forward Harmony

Greendaler asks: You have started as a Board Member of the Greendale Chapter, called BMAL, or Board Member at Large. Are you enjoying this important service to our Chapter?

Deana replies: Yes, I am enjoying learning how the chapter is run. I have been involved in the Board in the past of the **Yahara River Chorus** of Sweet Adelines.

Greendaler asks: What part do you sing in Forward Harmony and how did you get your start singing in the barbershop style?

Deana says: I sing Lead. I started singing barbershop back in 1999 with the **Yahara River Chorus** of Sweet Adelines. I had never sung barbershop before.

The only other singing experience I had was singing in our church choir and of course in my bedroom with a hairbrush as a microphone.

I played the organ when I was young and played flute in band in middle and high school. I am currently the lead section and visual leader of the **Yahara River Chorus**. I also sang in the **Charisma! Quartet** of Sweet Adelines for 17 years.

Greendaler asks: Tell us about your family when growing up. Where did you go to High School? Did you sing in their choir?

Deana replies: I grew up in Madison, WI and am an only child. I went to **East High School** but didn't sing in the choir. I was in the band though. I danced in a group from my junior and senior years of high school that did ballroom and folk dancing and we performed around the city.

Greendaler asks: Where did you go to college? What did you major in?

Deana answers: I went to the **Madison Area Technical College** (now **Madison College**) and majored in Medical Secretarial Science.

Greendaler asks: So, what do you do for a living? Are you using that major from college?

Deana says: Well, I just retired this past June, but when I was working, I worked for the **University of Wisconsin** for 38 years. I had various administrative positions in the medical field, but for the last 27 years I was the Program Manager for the Hematology/Oncology Fellowship program. In retirement we plan to travel as much as we can. We took a trip to Europe and Italy this past fall, we have a trip to Mexico coming up in February. We have a big trip planned for February 2025 to Australia and New Zealand as well as possibly a trip to Iceland in fall of 2025.

I also enjoy creating and nurturing the perennial gardens in our yard and my many houseplants. I enjoy cooking, baking, and reading too.
